#### 1.1 Invitation for Entries

The Federation of Indian Petroleum Industry ("FIPI") invites Entries from Global Startups in the Upstream Oil & Gas Sector in the following areas under the name of VASUDHA-IEW'26:

- a) Interpretation of Seismic and non-seismic exploration data.
- b) Digital & Artificial Intelligence interventions for finding, developing and production of Oil & Gas and reservoir management.

- d) Carbon Capture, Utilization & Storage (CCUS) and CO<sub>2</sub> based EOR technologies.
- e) Geothermal energy exploration, and utilization of existing well infrastructure.

## 1.2 Definition of Startup

The Applicant must qualify as a Startup under the definition of their respective Country or International Standards.

Whereas Vasudha-IEW'26 invites entries from the Countries other than India.

#### 1.6 Contents of the Entries

The Entries should include the following details:

- 1. Introductory Information on the Startup (Max.500 words)
- 2. Registration Certificate / Document of Proof qualifying the definition of startup as in Clause 1.2
- 3. Trademark Registration, if any.
- 4. Name and profile of Promotors and Investors, if any.
- 5. Promotors Agreement
- 6. Self-Declaration (not blacklisted anywhere by any organisation)
- 7. Intellectual Property Agreements, if any.
- 8. Business Plan highlighting the startup's vision, business model, and expected impact

## 2. Facilities to Selected Startups

# 2.1 Following facilities will be provided to Selected Top Two Startups during IEW 2026

- 2.1.1 To and fro Air Tickets (Economy Class) to 2 (Two) representatives from Registered Address of the each Startup to Goa, India.
- 2.1.2 Lodging and Boarding (including Hotel Accommodation in Goa) from one day prior to one day after the event i.e. from 26<sup>th</sup> January 2026 to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2026.
- 2.1.3 Transport facility for the event i.e. from 27<sup>th</sup> January 2026 to 30<sup>th</sup> January 2026.
- 2.1.4 Shell Scheme (3x3 Sq. mts) stalls for each of the selected startups to showcase their ideas in IEW 2026. Shell Scheme will consist of following items / facilities:
  - a. 42" LED (Wall mounted)
  - b. One Table and Four Chairs along with other amenities.
  - c. Art Work related to the startups for display, if any. FIPI will get the artwork done and pasted on the walls based on inputs and design provided by the Startups.
- 2.1.5 Startups shall also be provided an opportunity to meet and interact with CXOs of India's upstream Companies and/ or their teams.
- 2.1.6 During the closing ceremony of IEW 2026, Startups may be felicitated by the Hon'ble Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Govt. of India.

## 2.2 Eligibility Criteria

- 2.2.1 The Startup must be an overseas entity with or without office in India.
- 2.2.2 The Startup has not been barred by any country/ or any Government authority in India or by any court from participating in any event in India and the bar subsists as on the date of submission of Entries.
- 2.2.3 Stage of Startup: Ideation or Early-Stage (where early stage includes Bootstrapped/ Pre-seed/ Series A/Series B/Series C).
- 2.2.4 The Startup should be of maximum 10 years old (as of 1st Jan'26) from the date of incorporation.

- 2.2.5 The Startup should be operating in the energy value chain including any one of the areas mentioned under the clause no. 1.1.
- 2.2.6 An entity formed by splitting up or reconstruction of an existing business shall not be considered as a Startup.

## 2.3 Number of Proposals

The proposal should strictly pertain to one of the areas mentioned under the clause 1.1 without which the proposal shall not be considered.

## 2.4 Acknowledgement by the Startup

It shall be deemed that by submitting the Entries, the Startup has:

- a. Made a complete and careful examination of the Entries Notice;
- b. Acknowledged that it does not have any Conflict of Interest with the application and evaluation process of FIPI; and
- c. Agreed to be bound by the undertaking provided by it under and in terms hereof.

## 2.5 Right to reject any or all

- 2.5.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice, FIPI reserves the right to accept or reject any Entries and to annul the Selection Process and reject all Entries, at any time without any liability or any obligation for such acceptance rejection or annulment, and without assigning any reasons thereof. However, if such actions are taken after the mobilisation of the Startup, the promised logistics support for returning to the respective place of origin shall be ensured.
- 2.5.2 FIPI reserves the right to reject any Entries if:
  - a) at any time, it comes to the Notice of FIPI that a material misrepresentation is made by the Startup or uncovered by FIPI.
  - b) The Startup does not provide, within the time specified by FIPI, the supplemental information sought by FIPI for evaluation of the Entries.
  - c) The Startup is blacklisted/barred by any Central/State/Local Government/Authority in India or by any Court.
- 2.5.3 Any misrepresentation/ improper response may lead to the disqualification of the Startup.

#### 2.6 Language

2.6.1 The Entries with all accompanying documents (the "Documents") and all Communications in relation to or concerning the Selection Process shall be in English Language and strictly on the forms provided with this Notice. In case any of these documents is in another language, it must be accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case, for all purposes of interpretation of the Entries, the translation in English shall prevail.

2.7.2 Meeting over zoom for clarifications will be held on 1st September 2025, 09:30 (Hrs IST). All the Startups are requested to participate in the meeting for any final clarifications with FIPI. The details including time and Zoom link will be shared with all Startups in due course of time.

#### 2.8 Submission of Entries

- 2.8.1 Startups shall submit the Entries in the formats as per **Annexure-1** by 14:00 Hrs IST on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2025. Entries received after the due date and time will be liable to be rejected.
- 2.8.2 The electronic copy of the proposal is to be emailed at <a href="iew@fipi.org.in/karan@fipi.org.in">iew@fipi.org.in/karan@fipi.org.in</a>
- 2.8.3 The Startup should submit the Entries as an attachment to an email, the size of the same should not exceed 20 MB.
- 2.8.4 FIPI shall not be liable for any mistake or error or neglect by the Startup in respect of the above.

## 2.9 Confidentiality

2.9.1 Information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation, and recommendation for the selection of Startup shall not be disclosed to any person who is not officially concerned with the process or is not a retained professional adviser advising FIPI in relation to or matters arising out of, or concerning the Selection Process. FIPI will treat all information, submitted as part of the Entries, in confidence and will require all those who have access to such material to treat the same in confidence. However, FIPI reserves the right of publication and information sharing with public about the final selected entries and details thereof.

#### 2.10 Clarifications

- 2.10.1 To facilitate evaluation of Entries, FIPI may, at its sole discretion, seek clarifications from any Startup regarding its Entries. Such clarification(s) shall be provided within the time specified by FIPI for this purpose. Any request for clarification(s) and all clarification(s) in response thereto shall be in writing (through Email only).
- 2.10.2 If a Startup does not provide clarifications sought under Sub-Clause 2.10.1 above within the specified time, its Entries shall be liable to be rejected. In case the Entries is not rejected, FIPI may proceed to evaluate the Entries by construing the particulars requiring clarification to the best of its understanding, and the Startup shall be barred from subsequently questioning such interpretation of FIPI.

## 2.11 Indemnity

The selected Startup shall, subject to the provisions of the Agreement, indemnify and keep FIPI and its employees indemnified from all actions, proceedings, suits, claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, costs, charges, expenses, judgements and fines arising out of or in the course of participation by the Startup in IEW 2026.

## 2.12 Letter of Participation

After selection, a Letter of Participation (LP) in IEW 2026 shall be issued by FIPI to the selected Startup.

## 2.13 Jurisdiction and Applicable Law

All matters connected with the Process of Participation shall be governed by the Laws of India (both substantive and procedural) and shall be subject to exclusive jurisdiction of courts at New Delhi.

- **2.14** The Selection Process shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with the quidelines set by FIPI.
- **2.15** FIPI, in its sole discretion and without incurring any obligation or liability, reserves the right, at any time, to:
  - a) suspend and/or cancel the Selection Process and/or amend and/or supplement the Selection Process or modify the dates or other terms and conditions relating thereto:
  - b) consult with any Startup in order to receive clarification or further information;
  - c) retain any information and/or evidence submitted to FIPI by, on behalf of and/or in relation to any Startup; and/or
  - d) independently verify, disqualify, reject and/or accept any and all submissions or other information and/or evidence submitted by or on behalf of any Startup.

2.16 It shall be deemed that by submitting the Entries, the Startup agrees and releases the Federation of Indian Petroleum Industry and also its employees, agents and advisers, irrevocably, unconditionally, fully and finally from any and all liability for claims, losses, damages, costs, expenses or liabilities in any way related to or arising from the exercise of any rights and/or performance of any obligations hereunder, pursuant hereto and/or in connection herewith and also waives any and all rights and/or claims it may have in this respect, whether actual or contingent, whether present or future.

## 3. Criteria and Procedure of Evaluation

#### 3.1 Evaluation Criteria for Entries

Evaluation of the qualified Startups shall be done by a Selection Committee of eminent members from Oil and Gas Industry appointed by FIPI. The decision of the Selection Committee as regards to acceptance/ rejection of eligibility of parties will be final and binding.

## 3.2 Test of Responsiveness

- 3.2.1 FIPI shall intimate the shortlisted Startups to make a presentation to the Selection Committee.
- 3.2.2 Any information contained in the Entries shall not in any way be construed as binding on FIPI, its agents, successors or assigns, but shall be binding against the Startup if the right to participate is awarded to it.
- 3.2.3 FIPI will not entertain any query or clarification from any Startup at any stage of Selection Process. The evaluation and final ranking of the Entries would be carried out as per terms mentioned in this Notice.
